Day in and day out, the United Way of Logan County supports and leads programs that meet the most urgent needs in our county. You may be surprised at all the ways we are building a better Logan County. Your United Way is:



Improving the odds for young children's success in school through the administration of Dolly Parton's Imagination Library. **739 children (up 25% from last year)** are now receiving free books in the home to inspire a love of learning and ensure school readiness. **Over 14,200 books have been distributed** locally from July 2020 through August 2024 and **299 children have graduated from the program (turned age 5).**

Making resources more accessible through sponsorship of United Way 2-1-1. Logan County residents can call 2-1-1 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, free of charge to find the help they need. In the one year period ending August 2024, **250 requests for assistance were handled from Logan County residents (up 24% from last year)**, connecting callers to needed resources.



COMMUNITY IMPACT

In 2024, \$74,000 is being invested in **10 different programs** that provide important services in our community to hundreds of Logan County residents — seniors, youth and families, helping meet the basic needs of many. **For 2025, requests were received from 14 different programs seeking financial assistance from the United Way of Logan County.** \$74,000 has once again been pledged to support these vital community programs.
